2. Welcome address by the President:

The President, Mr. Uday Purohit, chairing the meeting, welcomed the Governing Council Members to the Google Meet link meeting.

Prior to commencing the proceedings, the President requested the Members to observe a one-minute silence as a mark of respect and prayer for Members who had died since the last GC meeting, namely Mr Sankar Chakraborty,

3. Adoption of Agenda:

The previously circulated Agenda for the 84th GCM was adopted by the GC.

4. Granting leave of absence:

Leave of absence was granted to GC members who had conveyed their inability to attend the GC Meeting. CMDE A Ravichandar, Mr Abhijit Banerjee , Mr V K Jain Nominated CMDE Bhupesh Tater (Hon Secretary-Mumbai Branch).

5. Adoption of Minutes of 83rd GCM:

The GC members adopted the Minutes of the 83rd GC which were circulated earlier via Email with the following amendments in the resolution No 83.35.10

Resolution No 83.35.10:

Resolved that with reference to resolution No 74.36.20.01 the GC approved the proposal of increased the Life membership fee by 10% (which is not put in the present 83rd GC).

6. Summary and update at Institute and Way forward for the Institute post Covid 19 lockdown, Social distancing norms feasibility

All premises closed; only local security guards are working with their 8 hrs duty.

With the growing threat of the Corona virus, Institute took the following measures to prevent its spread at IMEI

- 1. Cancelled all technical meetings and seminars across all Branches till lockdown
- 2. No meetings to be held in the IME(I) auditorium by third parties until lockdown
- 3. Vacated all Hostel rooms

7.Impact on Proposed Budget FY 2020-201 due to COVID 19 update:

The ALFSC subcommittee presented the estimated overall impact on the yearly budget because of cost cutting & reduction in cost on certain expenses/ and non-generation of income for April / May and upto June month, the overall throughout the year.

8. Reduction in expenses at HO and other Branches & proposed means of income generation.:

ALFSC Chairman Mr Kushal Roy explained on the various expenses of HO level which is going to reduce / cost cutting in and till the lockdown period due to COVID 19. He presented GC, the estimated earnings due to cost cutting from the various heads of expenses and losses of Income during the lockdown period. He also mentioned that the legal opinion obtained for certain reduction in cost cutting / expenses such as reduction on wages on administration/ training staff salary above 25000 and deduct up to 50% of consolidated wages per month for the all Faculty staff and the same decision was agreed and accepted by the faculty members as well staff administrative and training staff.

Proposed alternative means of Income Generation:

Institute has applied for permission to run virtual classes and the charging of fees for online classes

- Proposed a fee hike
- To develop online Module Training Courses with the quality of the contain to be developed with the guidelines / Syllabus / requirement of no of teaching hours of full time and visiting faculty, a small knowledgeable persons committee should be formed with includes the names of Mr B Ramesh from Chennai and Mr Rajiv Ramanujam from Delhi
- 2nd floor hostel to be utilized for running of classes and Research & development center etc
- Starting a new course for FG Class IV which does not require DG approval.
- To start the fresh batches online. The two challenges are document verification system and issuance of certificates.

- The 3-day course with Mr. V. K. Chandrashekaran on Materials, Inspections, Welding and NDT.
- Discussion with Kongsberg for virtual simulators and depending on indication from DG we have to pursue this with Kongsberg.

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9. Brief update of SC:

Sub Committee's Chairman updated reports are as under:

A.I Tax Cases:

AY 2009-10, 2011-12, 2012-13 - ITAT decision - Restore Back to CIT instead of AO

AY 2013-14, 2014-15 2015-16 & 2017-18 – Appeal filed with CIT

on similar issue, for A.Y. 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, & 2016-17 the income of the assessee has been treated as business income wherein the appeals are pending before the CIT(A), Mumbai. Therefore, respectfully following the previous orders and nature of activities remaining the same for this year also the other income is treated as business income.

To take the process of income-tax matters forward we appointed Bhuta Shah& Co LLP in place of M/s B K Khare & Co.

Meeting was held on dated 10.03.2020 in IMEI House with Bhuta Shah & Co to prepare a list of all the pending appeals before Id. CIT (Appeals) with full details, to seek an early appointment with the CIT official.

Also meeting was held on dated 13.03.2020 with Mr V K Jain, one of his colleagues Ex Sir Commissioner of I Tax, Mr Karthik Natarajan of Bhuta Shah & Co, one of the existing Commissioner of I Tax office, President and HGS to understand the IMEI I tax cases. They gone through our documents which were we submitted to AO / CIT & Tribunal and they will going to come back with the proper suitable suggestion after the lockdown is over.

Mr Satti Arora suggested name of Mr Tarun Kapoor Income tax official.

HGS informed about appointment of New Director Training - Present Deputy Director Mr Mohan Singh Pal will be Director (In Charge) till we decide alternative.

At present online lectures / Technical meetings are conducted through Zoom paid account subscription to 2 host and 1000 participants (large meetings) with and objective to keep candidates and faculty engaged.

Finalization of online platform for lectures is in process of finalizing and negotiations are on.

Discussed with Maersk lines for utilizing our simulator to run an ERM /EER course for them. CD had given them a commercial proposition.

AA) Association with "Virtual Guru": "VIRTUAL GURU" has contracted IME(I) to cover below scope of work.

- 1. To vet the existing question bank. Correct / delete the question or answer if it is wrong.
- 2. Add more questions to improve the standard and to cover the entire syllabus.
- 3. Segregate these questions in Easy, Moderate & difficulty levels.
- 4. Total requirement of 2000 questions for each course
- 5. Continuous upgradation with 3 months intervals.

Due to COVID 19 activities related with Question bank has stopped.

There is also a DGS circular stating that all STCW exit exams henceforth will be online and shall commence after lockdown. In view of same there has been no communication from Virtual guru and there is no one to coordinate from their office. Hence no further courses were sent for vetting as well as new question bank preparation. He has assured all this will be regular as soon as he is able to get his office functional.

IMEI have a contract with Eduquity for conducting the online NCV examination. There was an issue were questions were being repeated sometimes even in the same paper. Director had tried to have this sorted out but the ILET solution is and to enhance the question bank.

Action taken or Action to be taken: A suitable e-Circular shall be sent by HO to all the Members, informing them regarding the above revised policy. Thereafter, AGM Notice and reports can be uploaded on Website and circulated through iConnect & mass mailing.

IMEI iConnect – It was decided the subcommittee to look forward to find out the reality of usefulness of available features and benefits of the existing IMEI iconnect facility to the members.

Admission & Membership Sub Committee

Chairman of the Subcommittee informed GC about ratification in the minutes of the 83rd GCM to include 10% hike in membership fee structure proposed/discussed / agreed and which was circulated to all GC members to implement the same with immediate effect.

Following will be presented to GC prior next GC meeting when SC discussion is taken up in detail

- Annual subscription from henceforth cases to exist and the respective clauses in the ORP/AOA will be deleted and
- Only lifetime's membership up to the grade of eligibility shall be henceforth applicable as per the revised fee structure.
- Practice of charging applicants with fee up to fellow member grade shall be dispensed with immediate effect.
- Admissions/ membership dept to be paperless is a work in progress and shall be finalized when matter is taken up for detailed discussion by next GC meeting. Hence dept can continue their present task taking note of rise in 10% fee structure for immediate implementation.
- The staff will be guided on this by chairman SC / VKJ/ KKN as and when required.

Grievance Cell:

Immediate past President Mr C V Subba Rao reported that no grievance was received during the review period.

Benevolence Fund

Mrs. Sadhana Singh, wife of late Mr. S P Singh, AM 5726 approached us for a grant under the Benevolence fund of the Institute and as per resolution No. 35/36.01 dated 27.05.2009 ,Master PP Singh, gets a relief towards reimbursement of tuition fee of INR 1000/- per month and INR 2000/- per year for other school expenses till completion of schooling (XII standard) which together means a scholarship of \NR 14000/-for a period of 14 years. During this year IME(I) paid INR 14000/- from the Benevolence Fund. She has been paid Rs.14000/- (Rs.12000/- for fee @ Rs.1000/- per month + Rs.2000/- per annum for school uniform etc, for the year 2019-20 & Rs. 17000/- paid for the year 2020-21 in April 2020

Donation of INR 20 Lakhs received from Ocean Spark.le during this financial year INR 20 Lakhs 2019-20 INR 20 Lakhs 2018-2019 and INR 15 lakhs in the year 2017-18.

- An assistance of INR 1.25 lakhs per month from December 2017 is being provided to Mr. Sunil Hemant Wadgaonkar for his treatment & import of certain specific medicines.
- Subsequent to his commencing work as a faculty at a training institute the relief amount has been reduced to INR 1 lakh effective July 2018. (INR 6 lakhs paid during FY 17-18, INR 13 lakhs paid in FY 2018-19, and INR 12 lakhs paid during FY 19-20 and INR 1 Lakh in April 2020.
- Smt Rashmi Nagpaul ,wife of Mr. Rahul Nagpaul, who passed away on 15 November 2017, requested support from IME(I)'s Benevolent Fund. Mr.Nagpaul is survived by his wife and two daughters aged 12 & 3.
- Smt Nagpaul ,subsequent to undergoing an IT course, is now employed part time on a job and was placed with assistance from IME(I). Her children's education is now being supported with the grant of INR 10,000/- pm, approved in July 2018, which will continue till the complete their graduate studies. Annual payment made INR 1 Lakhs in the month of August 2018 and INR 5000/- paid towards computer training expenses. INR 1,25,000/- was paid for the FY 2018-19). She has been paid Rs.1,20,000/- for the year 2019-20 & Rs. 1,50,000/-paid for the year 2020-21 in April 2020

Mr. Pradip Kumar Biswas, was undergoing chemotherapy of the stomach/ liver and multiple myeloma is being supported from Benevolence fund to an extent of INR 1 Lakh every month from August 2018 to Dec 2018 initially and will be revived in Dec 2018. Rs. 8 lakhs was paid during the year 2018-19) and from April 2019 to Sept 2019 Rs. 6 Lakhs Lakhs was paid. Since Mr. Biswas has sadly passed away, this payment has now been stopped.
