- 7. <u>Welcome Address by President (Item No. 2)</u>. The President, Mr. Vijendra Kumar Jain, chaired the AGM and welcomed the members to the last AGM of the current term. Redacted version of his opening address to the General Body is as below:

#### Address by the President (Mr. Vijendra Kumar Jain)

Past Presidents, distinguished Lifetime Achievement Award winners, past office bearers of the IME(I), President Elect for the Term 2023-25, Vice President Elect and Honorary General Secretary Elect for the Term 2023-25, Members of the IME(I) attending physically and online, Ladies and Gentlemen.

I extend a warm welcome to you on behalf of the IME(I) at this 40<sup>th</sup> Annual General Body Meeting which is being held in hybrid fashion. It is indeed with a lot of sentiments that I stand in front of you today. I remember my father Mr. PC Jain who used to come here almost every weekend to ensure construction of this very IMEI House along with a lot of other enthusiastic Members. I remember him having become President of the IME(I) for the Term 1993-1995 and him standing here and delivering a similar address, that I am fortunate to give after 28 years. At the outset I wish to acknowledge God for giving me this

opportunity to serve the IME(I) over the last two years. I am most grateful to my mother Kanta Jain who is here in the audience and also to my wife Mridula who has always solidly supported my endeavors in the IMEI.

I am grateful to the team which has worked with me during the last 2 years with common goals. Every Governing Council Member either as a head of a sub-committee or Branch Representative or as a representative of an External body have all worked diligently to achieve the goals set out.

I am happy to share that your Institute has performed exceedingly well on most fronts during the year gone by. Amongst the lot of areas in which our GC Members have been working on and achieved success, I list a few of the most major ones:

- 1. We have in addition to the International Chapters being set up last year, have received an application of the starting of an International Chapter in Sri Lanka. Our next step will be to stabilise these chapters and use their strengths to develop our Institute on a global scale. Let us look to try and bring foreign nationals into our fold.
- 2a) After the staring of the 3 Students Chapters at HIMT, IMS Goa and Tolani Maritime Institute last year, we have continued our efforts and formed students Chapters in KMSME, Cochin University, Kochi and also in AMET University, Chennai The willingness of so many major Maritime Institutes to form these Chapters, shows us that we are on the right path. The number of student Members is steadily increasing and their involvement in Institute activities is the next step which is being pursued.
- 2b) Training and dissemination of information remains one of our prime objectives. Currently, we have training centres in Nerul and Kochi which have done well in expanding the number of courses that are being rolled out. We have during the last year applied to DG and received in-principal approvals for starting classes in Kolkata and Goa. With lots of efforts having gone into making the designated classes ready for DG audit and inspection, I am pleased to announce that we are now in the last stage of setting up and hope to roll out the classes during the next few months.
- 3. With respect to Technology adoption With a digitised library and a new website we have recently during the last week restarted the iConnect app. It is a powerful tool for communication with IMEI Members.
- 4. Representation of the IMEI at IMO sessions continue to get our support. Our Members have played in a critical role in the MEPC, HTW and ISWG-GHG sessions.
- 5. The last year saw the inauguration of the IGF Advanced course after the procurement of an IGF Simulator. The simulator which was procured from ARI, Delhi is type approved by DNV-GL and IME(I) has done exceedingly well in providing this training in India.
- 6. Knowledge sharing sessions, Updation of Mariners with the latest happenings at the MEPC sessions, numerous technical seminars across the country have all received the attention of IMEI Members.
- 7. INMACRCO 2022 was very successfully organised by the Mumbai Branch during November last year. The Director General of Shipping, in a first organised a Thematic Conference titled Green Shipping Conclave parallelly during INMARCO 2022. INMARCO 2022 was visited by our Shipping Minister Mr. Sarbananda Sonowal.
- 8. Rajasthan Chapter was started on April 2023 and has actively conducted events since its inception.
- 9. The SMLC, the Electronic Course and the Hydraulic Courses continued to held by the Mumbai Branch, providing excellent service to our Members

- 10. In a first, book Launches were held by the IMEI for its Members who have written books which are non-technical in nature.
- 11. The Omkarnath & Chuni Wazir Award for Excellence in Eductaion was instituted to award an IME(I) Member who has demonstrated passionate dedication to education in Marine Engineering.

After listing all these achievements, it is my duty to thank and highlight all those who have made this possible— I shall mention a few key persons who have gone beyond their normal limits of duty and responsibility to help the IMEI to achieve its goals.

1. First and foremost I wish to mention Mr. Yatindra Nath - GC Member of the Mumbai Branch. Continuation of his tremendous contribution in the  $2^{nd}$  year as well, in the Publication and Library subcommittee enabled additional goals to be set and achieved. The commencement of the in-house newsletter - iMellange during the year gone by deserves special mention. Mr. Sunil Kumar the inaugural Editor of this new creation due to his literary talent along with his passion and devotionhas resulted in the phenomena I growth and acceptance of the iMelange in a short period of time. The support of the sub-editor Ms. Rashmi Tiwari in systematically gathering the Branch news and articles month on month is noteworthy. On the technical side, the MER under the able editorship of Dr. Rajoo Balaji for now almost 4 years, has seen it evolve into a pure technical journal - just as the GC envisioned it out to be.

Cmde Bhupesh Tater our outgoing HGS, has served as a most able administrator during the term gone by. He has sorted out problems which kept cropping up with compassion and also with an iron hand, where necessary. He ensured that the sub-committee heads performed their tasks efficiently with regular follow-ups. This enabled the Governing Council to work in multiple areas simultaneously.

The next person I wish to make a special mention is that of Mr. AK Gupta. At the start of our term the starting of International Chapters was only a concept. Mr. AK Gupta with his experience and regular follow-ups has turned it into a reality. In the long term, the starting of these International Chapters will surely paly a major role in the growth of the IME(I).

He has served as a most efficient head and has piloted the starting of multiple courses. 

I would seek to establish grants and competitions specifically for young professionals, stimulating their involvement in research and innovation.
- 3) It will be my continual effort to position IME(I) as the foremost and highly trusted resource for any queries or support related to the practice of Marine Engineering and allied subjects. I aim for the institute to be recognised as a trusted global resource for marine engineering knowledge, focusing on emerging technologies, GHG emissions reduction, automation, and MASS concepts. I would like the Institute to Champion efforts to develop global marine engineering education standards to meet the changing environment and industry demands and Advocate for IME(I) as the authority to advise Administration on matters related to maritime technology, maritime professional training matters.
- 4) Ladies and Gentlemen, the Globalisation of IME(I) Has already commenced with foreign chapters it will be our effort to continue the good work in this direction and also create value for the foreign chapter members, so that these chapters not only grow in numbers but also in value.

With this vision I along with my team at the HO – Cdr Dr Bhaskar Bhandarkar the incoming Vice President – maybe a new entrant as an office bearer in IME(I) but a veteran at steering technical organisations in both technical and human element aspects Mr Sunil Kumar the incoming HGS – whose passion I have seen in conducting the student's session at INMARCO 2022 and who brings you the I Mélange every month and the incoming Governing Council Members and the teams at the Branches and Chapters – India and abroad will endeavour to fulfil the vision and objects of the Institute. I seek your continued guidance, support and trust in achieving the above.

I would also like to remind all members that next year India hosts the World Maritime Technology Conference 2024 (WMTC - 2024) and our Chennai Branch is hosting the same from 11<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> Sept. And before I thank all of you for listening to me patiently, I must thank the President Mr Jain the Vice President Mr. Bhatnagar, HGS Mr. Bhupesh and of course the entire Governing Council, which incidentally I was also privileged to be a part of, for the excellent work during the last two years.

There being no other points, Mr Amit Bhatnagar, Vice President presented the Vote of Thanks and thanked the members for attending physically and on-line in large numbers to consider certain important matters at hand. Mr Amit Bhatnagar also thanked the HO Staff for making the admin arrangements, the family of Mr R.L. Jain and Mr. PC. Jain, awardees and outstation members for attending the AGM. There being no other points, the meeting was drawn to a close.

13. #### **TGSC**

16. The IME(I)-INA Centre for Cooperation INA was inaugurated on 28<sup>th</sup> January 2023 to promote cooperation and interaction on matters marine engineering and naval architecture that have some similarity of purpose/ objectives. Discussions are in progress with METI at Cochin Shipyard Ltd., Indian Navy, and CUSAT for identifying mutual areas of collaboration and cooperation.

- 19. <u>IGF Advanced Course</u>. The Simulator for IGF (Advanced) was inaugurated by IME(I) President, Mr. V. K. Jain, and Chairman CDSC, Mr. Rajeev Nayyer on 26<sup>th</sup> December 2022 and the 1<sup>st</sup> course was conducted on the same date. The IGF(A) has been developed, reviewed and commenced by training division of IME(I) HO Nerul, Navi Mumbai and this hard work of 16 months paid off by successful commencement of the course. The simulator procured from Applied Research International (ARI) is type approved by DNV-GL, and IME(I) is a pioneer in providing this training in India.
- 20. Application has been made to DGS for increasing the frequency of the IGF (Basic) & IGF (Advanced) courses due to the rising demand. Applications have also been submitted to DGS for approval to conduct four more courses. During the period under review HO developed the following six new courses, signed an MoU with MTI of SCI (for the practical training on Fire Fighting System as part of the Course Curriculum) and approval for the same received from DGS: -
  - (a) Basic Training for Liquefied Gas Tanker Cargo Operations (GTFC).
  - (b) Advanced Training for Liquefied Gas Tanker Cargo Operations.

- (c) Basic Training for Oil and Chemical Tanker Cargo Operations.
- (d) Advanced Training for Chemical Tanker Cargo Operations.
- (e) Basic Training for Ships using Fuels covered within IGF Code (IGFB) Course Approval on increase in Batch frequency.
- (f) Advanced Training for Ships using Fuels covered within IGF Code (IGFA) Course Approval on increase in Batch frequency.
- 21. <u>Training at Branches</u>. Initiative to start various types of courses (Modular) in different branches of the Institute has been taken by the CDSC. After extended deliberations, it was decided as a first step to establish the Training Centre at Goa and Kolkata. The "in-principle" approval for both centres was applied under the guidance of HO by filling the Online Application Forms, followed by a presentation to the DGS Officials on the above. The "in principle" approval has since been granted for both centres and the branch representatives are fulfilling the requirements for approval.
- 22. The joint venture of IME(I) and MASSA Maritime Academy for conducting the 3 days Online Course "Electronic Engine Familiarization Course (ME-Type Engine)" is running successfully. CDSC is now working on the approval of MEO NCV courses (Upto 8000kW except Tankers) which is beneficial for NCV candidates, where they will get more opportunities on their work front.
- 23. <u>Assistance to Maritime Administration</u>. Answer scripts for different grades were evaluated by the Panel of examiners of IME (I). Faculty members take viva voce Oral examinations (Online) as external examiners.
- 24. Knowledge Sharing Sessions. On regular basis Students and faculty members at HO are participating in many Seminars / webinars on different topics being conducted by the Institute itself and also by the classification societies and other organizations for enhancement of their knowledge. On Saturday, 01 July 2023 a Seminar on "SIRE 2.0" was conducted by IME(I) Navi Mumbai Chapter & Career Development Sub-Committee along with Global Shipping Community for Members, students and Faculty members of the HO.

#### 25. Other Activities of Training Department.

(a) Annual inspection of CIP for Competency Courses as well as for Modular courses was carried out on 31<sup>st</sup> May 2023 by the Lloyd's Register and Grade A1 i.e., "Outstanding" was maintained. The Certificate is now valid till 20th June 2024. Our visiting faculty members also underwent the ERS I and ERS II with us. We are trying to utilize their services for the ERS courses. They will also attend the TSTA course.

- (b) Post course counselling is provided to the attendees and the MMD exam centre is kept in touch on day-to-day basis. RUT & IGF course students are being guided for the exit examinations and e-learning programmes.
- (c) As per DGS guidelines Centralised Attendance system was introduced at IMEI House for recording the attendance of the students who attending physical/classroom classes.

#### **Membership**

26. There has been a substantial increase in membership in the Student Grade during the period under review. The growth in Corporate Membership has been normal wherein numbers increased across all branches and chapters (except Delhi Branch) since the last AGM. The membership status as on 30.08.20 is placed at Annexure '**D**'.

#### Benevolence Fund

- 27. The Benevolence Fund has a balance of Rs. 108.46 Lakhs as on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2023. No fresh support has been provided from the Fund during the period under review and details of ongoing support activity and disbursement are as given below:

- 31. Overseas Chapters. The opening of these International Chapters brought a new dimension between marine engineering and maritime interests of a modern India and marked a milestone in the growth of the Institute since its formation on 19 Jul 1972, as the India Division Council of The Institute of Marine Engineers (IMarE), London..
- 32. **Rajasthan Chapter**. Rajasthan Chapter under the Delhi Branch was inaugurated on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 23 and has been actively conducting events since inception.
- 33. Opening of Students' Chapter. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Student Chapter was opened TMI, Pune in the presence of Shri. Vijendra Kumar Jain, President, IME(I).
- 34. <a href="INMARCO">INMARCO</a> 2022, the flagship quadrennial international maritime conference and exhibition, of IME(I) Mumbai Branch along with its Navi Mumbai & Gujarat Chapter was held from 17th to 19th November 2022 at Hotel Sahara Star, Mumbai. The event marked the eleventh edition of INMARCO organized by the IME(I). On the second day of the conference, Honourable Shri. Sarbanada Sonowal, Cabinet Minister for Ports, Shipping, and Waterways, addressed the participants, highlighting the progress made in various sectors, including shipping, under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Shri. Narendra Modi.
- 36. Seminar on "Shaping the Future of Indian Shipping: Strategies and Innovations for Decarbonisation". The next ISWG-GHG meeting was also held from 26<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023, at IMO Headquarters, London and chaired by Mr. Sveinung Oftedal. The Indian delegation was led by Shri Venkatesapathy S., Director, Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways and comprised Mr. Senthil Kumar Jayaraman, Engineer and Ship Surveyor/Deputy Director-General (Tech), Shri Gopikrishna C. Engineer & Ship Surveyor from the Directorate General of Shipping, Mumbai with IME(I) being represented by Mr. Chamarthy P.K. Kashyap, and Shri Rajeev Nayyer. The meetings were well attended by a majority of the member states and associate members of IMO, representatives from the United Nations and Specialized Agencies, the UNFCC & WB, observers from the intergovernmental organizations, the EC, OECD & IMSO, and from

  - (b) MEPC 80. The Indian delegation was headed by Mr. Ajithkumar Sukumaran, Chief Surveyor and Mr. Vikrant Rai, from the DGS and included Mr.
  - I.N. Bose & Mr. Mudit Mehrotra from INSA and Mr. Chamarthy P.K. Kashyap and Mr. Rajeev Nayyar from IME(I), along with Mr. Dasgupta, Mr. Mahesh Subramanian, Mr. Venkat Bamidi & Mr. Devrup Kabi.
- 49. <u>IMO Sub-Committee on HETW</u>. The 9<sup>th</sup> session of the Sub-Committee on Human Element, Training and Watchkeeping (HTW) was held from 6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> February 2023, at IMO London. A ten member Indian delegation attended the same. The key points covered in the meeting included; Model Training Courses. Role of the Human Element, fraudulent certificates, comprehensive reviews of the STCW convention and code and development of measures to ensure quality of onboard training as part of the mandatory seagoing service and measures to facilitate mandatory seagoing service required under the STCW convention.

## GUIDELINES FOR THE PRESENTATION OF OMKARNATH & CHUNI WAZIR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION

- The Institute of Marine Engineers (India) has decided to institute the OMKARNATH &
   CHUNI WAZIR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION to an IME(I) member who
   has demonstrated passionate dedication to education in marine engineering which
   benefits Marine Engineers or the Marine Engineering industry
- 2. The Award shall be called OMKARNATH & CHUNI WAZIR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION and shall consist of a memento, certificate and a cash prize. The Award shall be presented on the occasion of the 1<sup>st</sup> GC held in the year.
- 3. **ELIGIBILITY** Any Corporate Member of <u>IME(I)</u> who has demonstrated passionate dedication to education of marine engineering in the relevant year shall be eligible for consideration for the Award. The criteria for nomination may include the following:
  - (a) Preferably whole-time faculty at one of the IME(I) training centres.
  - (b) However, IME(I) may also consider the visiting faculty at above mentioned training centres.
  - (c) At various MTIs that are approved by the DG Shipping.

#### 4. **NOMINATION & EVALUATION**

- 4.1 The Nominations may be invited from following
  - a. The Director/Principal/Faculty of the IME(I) training centres and other Marine Engineering Training Centres
  - b. Educators can also nominate themselves.
- 4.2 The awardee shall be decided by an Evaluation Committee which will consist of the following: -
  - Chairman of CAREER DEVELOPMENT (CDSC) Sub Committee
  - Chairman of EXAMINATIONS & CERTIFICATION (ECSC) Sub Committee
  - Three (3) Office Bearers of HO viz.; The President, The Vice President and the Honorary General Secretary. In the event an office bearer is holding charge of either CDSC or ECSC or both, two GC members may be nominated by the GC in addition, for joining the Evaluation Committee.
  - One Subject Matter Expert, if appointed by the President.
  - In case of a tie, the President will have casting vote.

- 4.3 The President shall be free to nominate one Subject Matter Expert to this Evaluation Committee, if considered necessary. The decision of the Evaluation Committee Members shall be obtained and held on record, before announcing the results of the evaluation. The evaluation of the Evaluation Committee should be completed by 1st January each year, to enable make suitable preparations in time for the 1st GC meeting of the year.
- 4.4 The Evaluation Committee shall, after due scrutiny and consideration, finalize the name of the individual for the OMKARNATH & CHUNI WAZIR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION. The decision of the Evaluation Committee shall be final.
- 4.5 Evaluation will be broadly based on the below criteria of weightage percentage:

(a)	Feedbacks from the Director/ Principal/ Faculty/ Students of the training centres	20%
(b)	Research and/or articles printed in MER/other	20%
(c)	Commendations / awards received	20%

(e)	Mentorship carried out by the nominee - to be substantiated by the training centres and/or students	20%

- 5. If in any year no person is found suitable for the award, the award shall not be given in that year. Also, the award may be restricted to maximum of **1** awardee per year.
- 6. A representative / representative of the family of the institutor of the award would be invited to attend the award distribution ceremony to present the award albeit at their own cost and arrangements. Should they not be able to attend, the award may be presented by the President IME(I).
- 7. IME(I) shall meet all reasonable costs towards domestic travel, victualling and accommodation for the awardee to attend the award felicitation ceremony.
- 8. Mr. Sanjiv Wazir & Mrs. Sushma Wazir shall deposit a sum of Rs. 5,00,000/- with IME(I). The interest on the deposit of same will be used to fund the award. The award may be stopped after 25 years and the money absorbed into the IME(I) account.
