During the period under review the status of the following Modular courses conducted at IME(I) - HO was as under:

- i. 24 batches of ERS II (Management Level Course)
- ii. 14 batches of ERS I (DEGMCS),
- iii. 4 batches for ERS IV (Operational Level)
- iv. 23 batches of RUT course.
- v. 24 batches IGF (Basic)
- vi. 12 batches IGF (Advanced)
- vii. 5 batches AECS
- viii. 1 batch Basic (OCTO)

After getting approval for the IGF (Basic) & IGF (Advanced) for increasing frequency of the batches on 2023, now we are conducting two batches every month for IGF (Basic) and one batch for IGF (Advance).



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The approval we have received for the four new courses we are not able to run them because of the poor response. Only one batch of OCTO (Basic) was conducted with two candidates.

All competency courses, simulator courses, AECS and RUT courses were conducted successfully with almost full intake capacity.

b) Development of New Courses

- The approval for the following courses were received in June 2023:
- i. Basic Training for Liquefied Gas Tanker Cargo Operations –GTFC (New Approval)
- ii. Advanced Training for Liquefied Gas Tanker Cargo Operations (New Approval)
- iii. Basic Training for Oil and Chemical Tanker Cargo Operations (New Approval)
- iv. Advanced Training for Chemical Tanker Cargo Operations (New Approval)
- v. Basic Training for Ships using Fuels covered within IGF code (IGFB) Course Approval on increase in Batch frequency
- vi. Advanced Training for Ships using Fuels covered within IGF code (IGFA) Course Approval on increase in Batch frequency

For the conduct of the practical training for the Fire Fighting system for the above courses IME(I) has signed an MOU with MTI of SCI and T.S. Rahaman.

- CDSC was working on the approval of MEO NCV courses (Up to 8000kW, except Tankers) which is beneficial for NCV candidates on their work front. This was approved by the DGS and the circular was published on 28th May 2024. IME(I) HO has now started the MEO (CEO-NCV) course from 1st July 2024 and various batches have been scheduled for the bridging course of MEO (CEO-NCV) and MEO (SEO-NCV).
- IME(I) HO has received an excellent response to the MEO (CEO-NCV) bridging course, and batches are being scheduled accordingly.
 - c) The joint venture between IME(I) and MASSA Maritime Academy for the 3-day online "Electronic Engine Familiarization Course (ME-Type Engine)" had been running since October 2021 and the last batch was conducted in March 2024. The MoU has not been renewed as the revised terms and conditions proposed by MASSA were not acceptable to IME(I).

d) To start training centre & other related activities

CDSC is actively working to start various types of modular courses in different branches of the Institute. As a first step, "in principle" approval was obtained for the IME(I) Kolkata and IME(I) Goa branches. After receiving "in principle" approval from the DGS for IME(I) METC Kolkata and IME(I) METC Goa, both METCs applied for course approval.

IME(I) METC Kolkata applied for approval of 5 courses and an initial inspection was conducted by the local MMD Surveyor, during which some observations were made. After addressing these observations, a re-inspection was carried out on 20th May 2024 and a recommendation was given on 18th July 2024 by the PO MMD Kolkata. The application was then forwarded to the DGS for final approval.

IME(I) METC Goa applied for 2 courses and an inspection was conducted on 8th January 2024, where several observations were raised by the surveyors. These observations were addressed, and a reinspection was carried out. Since an MTI must have approval for at least 5 courses to operate, IME(I)



Promoting Knowledge, Building Relationships METC Goa subsequently applied for approval of 3 more courses on 15th May 2024. The necessary approval is in the process of being obtained.

CDSC has taken several initiatives viz.

- Group Discussions for MOT candidates across all categories, from Class 1 to Class IV, have commenced on a pan-India basis. A large number of experts are actively participating in addressing candidates' queries, marking this initiative as a success.
- ii. A Technical Essay Competition among various categories of members will be launched in due course.
- iii. The process of organizing more Technical Seminars has already begun.

e) Admission Software System:

Previously, course bookings at HO were managed manually. A software system was implemented in July 2023, and by November 2023, it became fully operational. Now, all course bookings, documentation, and payments are processed through this software system.

In addition to training course bookings, the system has been expanded to include other functions such as TAR Books and Library management.

The same software has also been implemented at IME(I) Kochi as an extended campus.

Hostel management, as well as Accounts and Administration functions, have yet to be integrated into the software system.

f) Assistance to Maritime Administration:

Answer scripts for different grades were evaluated by the IME(I) Panel of Examiners and Faculty members. Faculty members also conducted viva voce/ oral examinations online, serving as external examiners.

g) Knowledge Sharing Sessions

Students and faculty members at the Head Office regularly participated in various seminars and webinars on diverse topics, organized both by the Institute and by classification societies and other organizations, for knowledge sharing.

h) Comprehensive Inspection Program (CIP):

The annual inspection of the Continuous Improvement Program (CIP) for both Competency and Modular Courses was conducted on 6th June 2024 by IRS. The inspection resulted in maintaining the prestigious Grade A1, denoting "Outstanding" performance. Consequently, the certification is now valid until 20th June 2027.



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i) Faculty:

Including the Director of METC, IME(I) HO has 8 full-time faculty members. During the period under review, the following faculty members joined IME(I) as full-time faculty:

- i. Mr. Haresh Sadhwani (August 2023)
- ii. Mr. Manjit Singh Parmar (December 2023)
- iii. Captain Niraj Katoch (April 2024)

One full-time faculty member, Mr. Rajeev Valunjkar, retired on 31st May 2024 after reaching the age of 63 years. He had been serving since May 2018.

j) Faculty Training:

The following faculty members completed their AECS course as required by DGS

- Mr. Haresh Sadhwani Fulltime Faculty, METC HO
- ii. Mr. Manjit Singh Fulltime Faculty, METC HO
- iii. Captain Niraj Katoch Fulltime Faculty, METC HO

Mr. Haresh Sadhwani, Fulltime Faculty also attended the IGF (Advanced) course.

Our visiting faculty members also underwent the ERS I and ERS II with us. CDSC is trying to utilize their services for the ERS courses. They will also attend the TSTA course.

k) **Career Counselling**:

Presently at HO Career/ Course Counselling is provided by us as and when requested including queries raised telephonically, emails or by any other means of communication.

Post course counselling is also provided to the attendees and the MMD exam centre is kept in touch on day-to-day basis. RUT & IGF course students are being guided for the exit examinations and e-learning programs.

As per DGS guidelines centralised attendance system was introduced at METC - HO for recording the attendance of the students.

I) Review of the Performance of METC and its fee structure:

IME(I) HO is currently conducting the following courses based on demand, all of which are exclusively offered by IME(I):

- i. MEO Class IV (NCV) 2 batches per year
- ii. MEO Class III (NCV-SEO) Part A 2 batches per year
- iii. MEO Class III (NCV-SEO) Part B 2 batches per year
- iv. MEO Class III (NCV-CEO) 3 batches per year

In addition to the above, IME(I) HO is planning to schedule 3 batches of the MEO (CEO-NCV) bridging course and 2 batches of the MEO (SEO-NCV) bridging course per year.

The course fees for the NCV courses have been revised effective July 2024, with the last revision having been made in 2019.



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m) Library & Others

- HO Library process of digitalization: 440 books scanning has been completed and uploaded in the digital library.
- During period under review the HO has procured 6 nos. of books.
- Yearly MER(I) journal binding work done for the year 2023
- Yearly iMélange journal binding work done for the year 2023
- 17 nos. of Books for IME (I) Goa, 6 nos. of books for IME (I) Kolkata and 1 no. book for IME (I) Kochi procured for newly developed courses
- Books, IMO Model Courses, Videos for the newly developed courses and various equipment for IGF course were also procured for the METC Goa and METC Kolkata.
- For delivering lectures/ taking orals online webcams with mics were procured & fitted in the PCs of the faculty members.
- Learning resources were distributed to the students attending courses at IME(I) for their reference.
- Started Hindi & Marathi Newspapers in the Library to develop national & local language.

n) Financial Performance:

During the period under review (August 2023 to July 2024) the revenue collected from various courses (DG approved courses and value-added courses) was approx. Rs. 3,45,40,700 /- (Rupees Three Crores Forty-Five lacs Forty Thousand Seven hundred only).
